Re: Public Records Request

Dear Robert Bamberg:

I write in response to the public records request that you made to the Division of Occupational Licensure ("DOL"), received on April 27, 2026, in which you asked for information concerning the following: *I am requesting all public records in the custody of the Office of Public Safety and Inspections (OPSI) and/or Division of Occupational Licensure related to Construction Supervisor License CS-108712, from January 1, 2015 to the present date. This includes, but is not limited to: application materials, renewal applications, continuing education records, inspection or complaint history, disciplinary actions (if any), correspondence, license status changes, and any other documents associated with this license number.*

Enclosed please find copies of records responsive to your request absent information exempt from disclosure under the state public records law, G.L. c. 4, § 7. In particular, the documents that you requested include materials exempted by G.L. c. 4, § 7(26) from the definition of a "public record." The Privacy Exemption, under sub-clause (c) of clause 26 of G.L. c. 4, § 7, exempts the disclosure of personnel and medical information, as well as data, that if disclosed, would constitute an "unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." Accordingly, such information, if present, including but not limited to, dates of birth, social security numbers, previous addresses, email addresses, telephone numbers, and any other highly personal data, has been redacted from the materials provided.

DOL now considers this public records request closed. If you wish to challenge this response, you may appeal to the Supervisor of Public Records following the procedure set forth in 950 C.M.R. 32.08, a copy of which is available at [950 CMR 32.00: Public records access | Mass.gov](https://www.mass.gov/info-details/950-cmr-32-00-public-records-access). You may also file a civil action in accordance with M.G.L. c. 66, § 10A.
